Legal framework

Decree of 20/12/01 (M.B. : 17/01/2002): Decree relating to health promotion in schools.

Decree of 16/05/2002 (M.B. : 07/06/2002):

Decree relating to health promotion in non-university higher education.

Presentation

To comply with the requirements for doctors who wish to work in the Health Promotion in Schools department (PSE) - or a psycho-medico)social center (PMS), a certificate is organised in the field of "school medicine - promoting health in schools".

Special conditions of access / students concerned

This training is addressed to those holding a Masters degree in Medicine who are preparing to practice or who are already practicing in the context of health promotion in schools and who need to regularise their qualification during their first year of activity.
